Introduction	<ul> <li>Dr. Coll introduced Dr. Barry Bittman;</li> <li>✓ Dr. Bittman is a neurologist, author and speaker;</li> <li>✓ He is the Chief Innovation Officer of Meadville Medical Center;</li> <li>✓ A group of physicians and Board Members attended Estes Park and heard him speak;</li> <li>✓ They wanted him to come and speak so more of the medical staff could hear what he has to say;</li> <li>✓ She welcomed Dr. Bittman.</li> </ul>

Guest Speaker: Barry Bittman M.D. Medical Homes, Community Case Management, Developin New Systems of Care in Alignment with Goals of the Affordable Care Act and Triple Aim	<ul> <li>n, Dr. Bittman began the evening by telling a little bit about himself;</li> <li>Gave a presentation entitled, "Reengineering Healthcare In Your Community", highlights as follows:</li> <li>✓ Quality healthcare is in jeopardy;</li> <li>✓ The cost of healthcare has grown dramatically over the</li> </ul>	



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	<ul> <li>in the U.S. annually;</li> <li>Millions of Americans are uninsured with additional people underinsured;</li> <li>The U.S. is an aging nation;</li> <li>How can hospitals increase efficiencies, cut costs and still deliver quality healthcare;</li> <li>Hospitals and medical staffs must work together to be successful;</li> <li>There must be an outcomes-based focus on "optimizing health outcomes and quality in concert with cost-effectiveness;"</li> <li>Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs was reviewed;</li> <li>Healthcare fits in under "safety needs" at the base of the pyramid;</li> <li>He explained the Patient-Centered Medical Home;</li> <li>The concept of building a "Patient Centered Medical Condominium" and the key elements;</li> <li>The affordability of care coordination, bundled payments and shared savings programs were all reviewed;</li> <li>Accountable Care Organizations (ACOs) were explained;</li> <li>He noted that the healthcare bill was actually introduced during the Bush Administration and never had any opposition until it became associated with Obama;</li> <li>Healthcare is in trouble;</li> <li>What can we and are we going to do about it?</li> <li>bbittman@healthcare.org</li> </ul>	



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	<ul> <li>DISCUSSIONS/CONCLUSIONS</li> <li>Ms. Barr stated: <ul> <li>Because of the way the rules were written 80% of our patients would be assigned to urban hospitals;</li> <li>Last year she approached Renown and asked them if they would be interested in partnering with the 12 rural hospitals that she is working with;</li> <li>Renown has a great number of patients that come from rural hospitals;</li> <li>They are willing to partner with us in an ACO;</li> <li>With Renown's assistance, it has become possible for us and the 11 other rural hospitals to create an ACO;</li> <li>This as a great opportunity ig we can be effective in doing this, to lead the nation;</li> <li>Renown has been incredibly generous in working with us;</li> </ul> </li> <li>Dr. Bittman stated that Renown is getting as much out of this partnership as the rural hospitals are, they are being generous because it is good business for them;</li> <li>The meeting was opened up for questions and discussion;</li> <li>Dr Ganong asked Dr. Bittman about utilization and cost savings for quality, not knowing exactly who our frequent flyers are.
