Pay and Differentials, HR-2206

PURPOSE:

To provide fair, competitive salaries based on previous experience and differential for work out of classification.

RISK:

The risks associated with an employee not being aware of the outlined pay scale placement and differentials below is that an employee may be unaware of the compensation they are entitled to or how their minimum starting wage was determined.

PAY SCALE PLACEMENT:

To provide fair, competitive salaries based on previous experience, management may hire licensed and certified personnel into the salary structure above the minimum on the salary range based on qualifications and experience.

A. During the interview process the Nurse Manager and/or Administrator must determine an applicant's years of relevant previous experience and take into account an applicant's breaks in employment, or employment in other areas. Based on the applicable years of previous experience, the Administrator will determine the range in which they can offer a hiring wage.

B.	YEARS OF EXPERIENCE	MINIMUM STARTING PAY RATE
	0 - 2 years	Between pay range minimum, up to 5% above pay range minimum
	3 - 5 years	Between pay range minimum, up to 10% above pay range minimum

YEARS OF EXPERIENCE	MINIMUM STARTING PAY RATE
5 + years	Between pay range minimum, up to 15% above pay range minimum

- C. The Administrator will review internal equity of existing staff to determine a wage within the above guidelines.
- D. The Administrator **may not** pay over guidelines without approval from the Chief Nursing Officer of TFHD. In certain circumstances, including hard-to-fill positions or applicants with considerable experience, an employee may be hired over the mid-point in the salary range.

PAY SCALE PLACEMENT FOR CHANGE OF STATUS OR PROMOTION:

- A. Employees changing status from per diem to full or part time status will be placed on the salary range based on previous experience and years of employment.
- B. Employees transferring to a job in a higher pay range may receive an increase of at least 2.5% in base hourly rate by virtue of any promotion. A promotion shall mean a position in a different and higher paying job classification. The determination of salary increase will be based on skills, ability and experience.

DIFFERENTIALS:

Employees who are assigned to work in a higher paying hourly job classification may be eligible for higher rate of pay.

A. Procedure for Licensed Job Classification:

- Employees scheduled to work, or accepting positions outside of their job classification, will be paid in addition to their base hourly rate based on the following quidelines:
 - a. Lead; charge nurse roles 5% differential
 - i. Responsibilities
 - a. Day to day operations
 - b. Represent area in meetings
 - c. In-service department employees
 - d. Update policies and procedures
 - e. Ordering
 - f. Staff Scheduling
 - g. After hours responsibilities

B. Procedure for Non-Licensed Job Classifications:

1. Employees who are assigned to work in a higher job classification by their Manager

- shall be paid 5% above their base pay, or the pay range minimum of the higher classification, whichever is higher.
- 2. Employees covering for a Manager for a period of greater than three (3) days will be paid 5% above their base pay unless such coverage is required by their job description.
- 3. Employees who assume responsibility on an interim basis shall have the right to negotiate, with their Manager and the Administrator Administrator, for an increase related to the amount of management responsibilities assumed.

Employees who are assigned to work Nights are entitled to additional compensation.

A. Night Differential:

- 1. Employees working between the hours of 9:00pm and 5:00am will receive a night shift differential of \$5.50 per hour.
- B. Shift differentials only apply to hours worked

Intermittent Pneumatic Compression Devices, NS-1911

PURPOSE:

To prevent deep vein thrombosis venous thromboembolism (VTE) in patients at Truckee Surgery Center.

POLICY:

The employees and physicians at Truckee Surgery Center will follow accepted standards of medical practice and a risk factor assessment sheet for use of DVT (Deep Vein Thrombosis) stockings/ Intermittent Pneumatic Compression on patients. This policy excludes pain clinic patients.

Intermittent Pneumatic Compression Devices, also called Sequential Compression Devices (SCD's), are used during surgery to prevent pooling of blood in the lower extremities, and the potential development of VTE. However, compression devices are not suitable for use on all patients. As part of the patient assessment process, all surgical patients will be assessed for risk factors for VTE, as well as for contraindications to the use of compression devices. The decision to use or decline to use compression devices ultimately lies with the attending physician.

PROCEDURE:

- A. Prior to surgery, a risk factor assessment will be completed on ALL surgical patients by utilizing the MedVantage risk assessment form. The pre-operative nurse's assessment will be based on the patient's demographics and, history and physical formand planned surgical procedure to determine whether it is medically necessary for the patient to have intermittent pneumatic compression stockings.
- B. The patient will also be assessed for contraindications to the use of compression devices. Such contraindications include, but are not limited to:
 - 1. Severe arteriosclerosis or other ischemic vascular disease
 - 2. Known or suspected acute current Deep Vein Thombosis ("DVT") or phlebitis

- 3. Severe congestive cardiac failure, or any condition in which an increase of fluid to the heart may be detrimental
- 4. Pulmonary embolism
- 5. Any localized condition which the devices could potentially exacerbate, such as:
 - a. Gangrene
 - b. Recent skin graft
 - c. Dermatitis
 - d. Untreated, infected wounds
- C. The physician will then review the risk factor assessment and sign the form in the place to showto indicate that the DVT prophylaxis is, in fact, medically necessary based on the patient's risk factors.
- D. Any patient with a total risk factor of two or greater (moderate risk) as stated on the risk factor assessment will receive intermittent pneumatic compression stockings.
 - 1. The scale is as follows:
 - a. Low Risk: < 2 points
 - b. Moderate Risk: 2 points
 - c. High Risk: 3+ points
 - d. Very High Risk: 5+ points
- E. The following surgical patients will be excluded from the use of pneumatic compression devices:
 - 1. Planned local only anesthesia
 - 2. Planned monitored anesthesia care (MAC), unless there is a history of previous VTE
 - 3. Patients less than 16 years of age
- F. See attached release form and Venous <u>Thrombosis</u>Thromboembolism Risk Factor Assessment provided by MedVantage.

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Administrator Update for Board of Managers Q4 2023 Meeting

Operations & Service Lines

- Volumes are increasing with the addition of Urology. July 39. August 45. September 50. CY2022 Total: 459 CY 2023 completed and scheduled as of 12/6/2023 Total:514
- Urology has begun performing vasectomies the 1st and 3rd Thursday morning of the month. They are filing their blocks. Dr. Wainstein has expressed interest in bringing more procedures now that we have new towers.
- GYN wants to perform Hysteroscopy Myosure and Novasure procedures. Due to the high cost of the supplies/disposables and poor reimbursement we are limited on which payers we can do.
- IOVERA- Dan is working on obtaining his US training. We will not be able to do Medicare IOVERA cases due to low reimbursement.
- ENT is hoping to expand services to TSC now that we have the ability to utilize the ENT scopes. We had to decline a case due to the implant cost exceeding the reimbursable amount.
- Plastics with Dr. Watson is anticipated to launch this Winter. There is an overall concern about performing these cases.
- Case Costing is being done on 100% of cases. Comparative reports for our top procedures will be reviewed with providers to identify opportunities for savings on higher cost supplies. Supply costs continue to increase.
- Our billing company is continuing efforts to decrease our % of 90 but is not meeting our goals.
 - o Blue Shield is grossly underpaying our claims with implants. We have sent demand letters to Blue Shield for 18 accounts totaling \$52k.
 - o Blue Cross- 16 accounts in appeal totaling \$15k
 - There are a few work comp claims that we have had trouble reaching the adjuster. Proper follow up is happening.
- We are seeking out a new RCM company. I have met with 4 companies. They will be providing revenue cycle evaluations and presentations. Once we have heard from all of them a decision will be made. Our current agreement with Surgical Notes ends 3/31/24 but we can term early with cause.

Facility and Equipment

- Temperature improvements noted throughout the facility.
- Stryker Towers arrived in September.
- Stryker Beach Chair was purchased and arrived at the end of November
- Arthrex Trimano Arm holder, SPD Containers, and Stryker Tourniquet were approved for Q2 FY 2024. CERs will be submitted.

Staff/HR

- The per diem Scrub tech is still posted. This is a challenging position to fill.
- We interviewed an RN who can cover Pre/PACU and OR Scrub/Circulate. This would be to fill a per diem role.
